## Round Up of Last Week's Games

The Panthers had two match ups last week.

On Monday, they traveled to Ponte Vedra to take on the The Ponte Vedra Sharks. forwards had speed and were able to pressure the Ridgeview defense. Seven minutes into the game, a Ponte Vedra forward broke through the Panther back line and sprinted to goal to score. The Sharks were on the scoreboard again nine minutes later when they were awarded a corner and the kick was deflected into the net. The Panthers were able to get one back when they were awarded a free kick outside of the eighteen yard box. Janelle Echevarria took the kick and sent the ball into the upper 90

of the goal to make it 1-2. However, in the dying seconds of the first half, the Sharks responded with a lob shot from outside of the 18 yard box that sailed into the goal. The first half ended 1-3. The Sharks continued to push through the Panther defense in the second half and scored three additional goals to make the score 1-6. The Panthers pushed hard in the final quarter and were rewarded when **Allison Dailey** passed to **Alyvia Goodwin** who scored with a shot from the edge of the eighteen yard box. The Panthers got an additional goal in the final minutes of the game when **Casey Miller** took advantage of a goalmouth scramble to put the ball in the net. The final score was 3-6.

In the varsity game, the Panthers played defensively. They were able to hold Ponte Vedra in the first half but were

The Golden Eagles equalized with just ten minutes to go in the game when they scored from a free kick outside of the eighteen yard box. The Panthers were able to regain their lead two minutes later when an Anya Alecca free kick, from well outside of the eighteen yard box, deflected off a defender, over the keeper, and into the goal. The final score was 2-1.
